

EACC 15th Coprolite Run & Mopedjumble

Coprolites are phosphate nodules, popularly attributed to fossilized dinosaur poo, which were collected on the beach, crushed, and sold as fertilizer. The discovery of this substance in the district of Bawdsey Ferry is attributed to the Rev J S Henslow, Professor of Botany at Cambridge University, who first saw it when he stayed at Felixstowe with his family in 1843. In 1854, a series of letters were published by an unknown gentleman under the *nom-de-plume* of 'Humble Grumble', describing Felixstowe of that time. The people who lived in the cluster of houses at Bawdsey Ferry were, he tells us. Very poor, 'subsisting chiefly on lobsters and Coprolites'.

19.6	▶▶▶	Staggered crossroad at Nacton bear right through Nacton Village
20.6	◀◀◀	Left on to A1156 towards Ipswich, Caution : traffic !
		After bridge take centre turning lane.
20.9	▶▶▶	Right into Straight Road to Foxhall.
21.4	▶▶▶	Right at Foxhall Green to Bucklesham.
22.9	▶▶▶	Right before <i>Shannon</i> pub to Bucklesham Village Hall on right. Total 22.9 miles (if you rode to the Ferry Jetty).

Directions to assembly point at Bucklesham Village Hall

A14 headed east toward Felixstowe, Over Orwell bridge.

Pass turnoff for Nacton & Ransomes Europark, pass McDonalds on left

Exit sliproad A12 North Martlesham Lowestoft Bucklesham

Get into Right hand lane down this sliproad onto roundabout

Leave roundabout on second exit to Bucklesham

Road comes out opposite a motor cycle garage.

Right at this T junction and up through village

Turn up Levington Lane by *Shannon* Pub.

Bucklesham Village Hall is 50yds on right.

Limited parking at Bucklesham Village Hall may be prioritised for Jumble Trader vehicles. Overflow parking is available at the Playing Field – continue up Levington Lane and take 1st right, through gate to playing Field, unload your bike and ride it round to the Hall.

Complimentary refreshments at hall on arrival.

Traders are welcome to set up Jumble Stalls within the Village Hall or in the car park. Free pitches – free entry.
